Senior Dog Health & Wellness Initiative



Your best friend is a little slower on her walks, but she still loves to play. She sleeps more and her joints ache a bit, but she is as happy as she was the day you first met. She has become a little grey in the face, but she never complains. She is a member of an elite crowd and you wouldn't have it any other way because you know <u>Old Dogs Rule</u>.

Thanks to improved veterinary care and advances in canine health research, our dogs are living longer than ever before. Senior and geriatric dogs need specialized care and the AKC Canine Health Foundation's (CHF) Senior Dog Health and Wellness portal provides articles and podcasts about health resources and cutting-edge research to help our four legged friends grow old gracefully.

Currently, roughly 40% of veterinary clients are classified as senior dogs. According to the Metzger Animal Hospital Age Chart developed by Dr. Fred Metzger, which takes into account not only your dog's age, but also their weight, a 55 pound dog who is eight years old would be roughly equivalent to a person who is 55 years old. Generally speaking, most veterinarians begin to classify dogs as seniors around age eight.

HOW CAN I GET INVOLVED & HELP SPREAD THE WORD THAT OLD DOGS RULE?

Help celebrate the joy senior dogs bring to our lives! Post a photo to your social media account and encourage your friends to do the same. Include a few short sentences explaining why your #OldDogsRule.

Consider adopting a senior dog. Often overlooked, senior dogs can be wonderful additions to a family. Many <u>breed rescue groups</u> are actively looking for homes for senior dogs, as are local shelters.

10 Halloween Safety Tips for Pets



Halloween can be a festive and fun time for children and families.
But for pets? Let's face it, it can be a downright nightmare. Forgo the stress and dangers this year by following these 10 easy tips.

1. Trick-or-treat candies are not for pets.

All forms of chocolate -- especially baking or dark chocolate -- can be dangerous, even lethal, for dogs and cats. Symptoms of chocolate poisoning may include vomiting, diarrhea, rapid breathing, increased heart rate, and seizures. Halloween candies containing the artificial sweetener xylitol can also be poisonous to dogs. Even small amounts of xylitol can cause a sudden drop in blood sugar and subsequent loss of coordination and seizures. And while xylitol toxicity in cats has yet to be established, it's better to be safe than sorry.

2. Don't leave pets out in the yard on Halloween.

Surprisingly, vicious pranksters have been known to tease, injure, steal, and even kill pets on Halloween night. Inexcusable? Yes! But preventable nonetheless.

3. Keep pets confined and away from the door.

Not only will your door be constantly opening and closing on Halloween, but strangers will be dressed in unusual costumes and yelling loudly for their candy. This, of course, is scary for our furry friends. Dogs are especially territorial and may become <u>anxious</u> and growl at innocent trick-or-treaters. Putting your dog or cat in a secure room away from the front door will also prevent them from darting outside into the night ... a night when no one wants to be searching for a lost loved one.

4. Keep your outdoor cats inside several days before and several days after Halloween.

Black cats are especially at risk from pranks or other cruelty-related incidents. In fact, many shelters do not adopt out black cats during the month of October as a safety precaution.

5. Keep Halloween plants such as pumpkins and corn out of reach.

Although they are relatively nontoxic, such plants can induce gastrointestinal upset should your pets ingest them in large quantities. Intestinal blockage can even occur if large pieces are swallowed. And speaking of pumpkins ...

6. Don't keep lit pumpkins around pets.

Should they get too close, they run the risk of burning themselves or knocking it over and causing a fire.

7. Keep wires and electric light cords out of reach.

If chewed, your pet could cut himself or herself on shards of glass or plastic, or receive a possibly life-threatening <u>electrical shock</u>.

8. Don't dress your pet in a costume unless you know they'll love it.

If you do decide that Fido or Kitty needs a costume, make sure it isn't annoying or unsafe. It should not constrict movement, hearing, or the ability to breathe or bark and meow.

9. Try on pet costumes before the big night.

If they seem distressed, allergic, or show abnormal behavior, consider letting them go in their "birthday suit". Festive bandanas usually work for party poopers, too.

10. IDs, please!

If your dog or cat should escape and become lost, having the proper identification will increase the chances that they will be returned. Just make sure the information is up-to-date, even if your pet does have one of those fancy-schmancy embedded microchips.




If a dog is wagging his tail, that always means he's happy, right?

And if he's standing totally still, that means he definitely wants to be petted, correct?

If you agree with the two above statements, we hate to break it to you, but you may need a refresher in dog body language. The truth is sometimes a wagging tail can indicate anxiety, and a still, quiet stance often means fear. By knowing what a dog is trying to tell you, you will know how to respond appropriately, whether it's backing off or accepting a friendly greeting. Start studying with this chart below. (Parents: This is a great tool for kids, who are sometimes too quick to greet a strange dog.)


